

COMMANDING OFFICER FIELD MEDICAL TRAINING BATTALION – EAST COMMAND POLICY FOR PROHIBITED ACTIVITES AND CONDUCT PREVENTION RESPONSE



MCO 5354.1F establishes policy and defines specific prohibited activities and conduct. The Order includes, but is not limited to, acts or participation in hazing, bullying, ostracism, harassment in any form, wrongful distribution or broadcasting of intimate images, and dissident or protest activities, including supremacist activity.

These behaviors violate our Core Values of Honor, Courage, and Commitment and undermine the dignity, respect and trust that is critical to our success. As such, prohibited activities and conduct will not be tolerated and will be immediately addressed.

Every Marine, Sailor, Civilian, and student in the command is a leader and is responsible for the safety of self and all those in their professional and personal lives. Prohibited activities and conduct are to be avoided by all and, if discovered, reported immediately in accordance with the Order. Retaliation or reprisal against reports by any member of this command, knowing failure to report, or false reporting will be subject to disciplinary action.

Reporting of violations may be verbal or in writing to any member of the Chain of Command or by contacting the Field Medical Training Battalion - East Equal Opportunity Representative.
