

# COMMANDING GENERAL'S POLICY STATEMENT ON FAMILY READINESS

The Unit, Personal, and Family Readiness Program is designed to establish a support network for Marines, Sailors, and their families both within an organization and aboard their service installation. This program is not just for deployable units. The Unit, Personal, and Family Readiness Program is for all Marines, Sailors, and their families, regardless of their location, their mission, or their status.



All leaders are expected to be familiar with the contents of MCO 1754.9 and fully embrace their role within the Unit, Personal, and Family Readiness program.

Commanding Officers will appoint a Family Readiness Officer who will serve as the primary liaison between the host installation's Marine Corps Community Service Office (or sister service equivalent). He or she will be expected to ensure Marines, Sailors, and their families are aware of programs aboard their installation that can assist them in establishing a solid foundation of support. This individual, coupled with the rest of the Command Team, will facilitate a solid Unit, Personal, and Family Readiness Program which adequately represents the needs of their unit.

As leaders, we must remain engaged with our individual Marine and Sailor and their needs. It is our responsibility to ensure they are set up for success as they face the challenges of their assigned duties within Training Command and that their families are well equipped to continue to successfully support them. Our Marines and Sailors and their family members deserve nothing less.
